The sample of the study consists of 20 students belonging first year B.Tech students at Hindustan Institute of Technology and Science. The researcher has adopted questionnaire, library survey methods and conducted an interview with the students for this dissertation. Two questionnaires have been prepared to collect data from the students. The researcher has used random sample method to collect the data.
