The aim of present research paper is to portray the self-consciousness and job paucity affecting modern Indian youth, in contemporary society. Chetan Bhagat attracts reader's attention on various social issues through his writings. He inculcates social values in youth and enables them to solve problems. The author has presented exploitation of corporate sector in a realistic manner through his novel One Night @ the Call Center, which critically examines call center workers lifestyle. This is a story of thwarted ambition, lost love, patriarchal pressure and middle-class anxieties and insecurities about career and inadequacy of marriage with modern family conflict. All the characters in this novel are modern youth who are open minded.Bhagat makes keen observation of prevailing surrounding and as it presents in his works. His writing gives a realistic portraiture of harsh realities of life. The workload and busy schedule of modern youth in corporate sector compel them to ignore their selfconsciousness. In One Night @ the Call Center author hints through God call to focus on their inner call, which has been ignored due to work pressure and job Insecurities. Through this novel Bhagat represents the life struggle and sufferings of middle-class youths, who are exploited by higher authorities. They are not given credit for their hard work. All characters feel happy and relaxed only after getting call from God. In India financial crisis create great obstacles in the way of students and make them to join call center job, which pays them best. Thus, Bhgat has presented middle class youth's problem in realistic way.

Deivasigamani describes, Bhagat has presented social imbalance prevailing in society through this novel in a realistic way. The story of this novel not only reveals the adventures of employs at call center but also their pains, exploitations and their goals for future. This novel obtained enormous commercial success in country being a saga of Indian authority in globalized environment. This is a story of six characters who work in a call center Gurgaon. This novel presents how country plays an important role in commanding over business process and information technology. In this book writer has made a realistic portraiture of India's call center and a very tough schedule of employees who works at night shift. "The book touches the nerve of India's call center generation and presents a realistic picture of BPO life which is very tough as the employee have to work daily at night shifts with the constant threat of downsizing hanging over their heads like Damocles' sword and the continuous cursing by clients from USA who holds the Indian responsible for the shortage of jobs in their own country." In One Night @ the Call Center, Bhagat presents a realistic portraiture of a contemporary educated society working in a

He stresses through this novel on the prominence of education how it plays an important role in human beings' life to earn their living. Seriously speaking, a call center, like any other job, has its pros and cons. In modern age, youth are attracted towards this field on a large scale, because it is like a heaven for those who are under-performers but have good speaking skills, or for those who need money to complete their education.Shyam Mehra is the main protagonist and agent of call centre in this novel, including Shyam there are six characters who work in night shift. The story of this novel begins, Shyam gets up early from his horrible dream, he wants to think more about his dream but he is getting late for his night shift. He tells us there is a marriage function at his home so some relatives are at home to attend the function. The environment at his home is like typical Indian marriage function, where all his aunties are busy in making themselves beautiful, nobody lets Shyam use his bathroom besides it there is nothing to eat at home all are to eat outside. His aunties have no time because they are busy in applying cosmetics on their face for making themselves beautiful. He could not use bathroom and find food in kitchen nobody is free. He says good bye to all his relatives but nobody cares him. Because his cousins are doctors and engineers but he works in a call center so nobody cares him, if he has

Other characters of this novel are: military uncle who is punctual and hates to those who comes late. Radhika, Esha from Chandigarh, works in call center to be a model, Vroom and Priyanka, she is exgirlfriend of Shyam. Through this novel writer reveals the reality of call center work place where millions of educated young men and women earn their livelihood and face the challenge of private sector. Bakshi is their boss who is a cruel, bad and incomplete boss. He never wants to do work but always takes the credit of other's work. He takes the credit of Shyam's work of website design getting a transfer to Boston in the deal. He takes the credit of Shyam and Vroom's work. They both prepare a manual after six months hard work on it but Bakshi takes its credit. They can't clarify it for the fear of expulsion from job. He exploits employees in the name of promotion. There is much corruption in job field, first people don't get placement, if they

get surviving is painful. Bakshi assigned to Shyam for training and other work which is not his duty, besides it he imposes his own work on him, due to overburden Shyam gets depressed. Through this novel Bhagat has presented the harsh and painful reality of modern youths who have to listens the jargons and abuse of their boss without their fault, lest they should be fired from their job. They face humiliation from customers also as well as from their boss. It all is happening on account of corrupt politicians and lack of employment because corrupt government is not creating any job opportunities for youths. This is the reason why they are being exploited. They work hard day and night to make their plan but the people like Bakshi take their advantage. Thus, we see youths in frustration and overpressure are becoming addict to smoking and drinking. Either it be the field of education or call center job. On the other hand, Esha who wished to be a model puts her virginity at stake, but more pathetic is that in spite of losing her virginity she is rejected;

"The guy I slept with-forty-year-old designer "told my agent later I was too short to be a ramp model and that son of a bitch sends some cash as compensations after words. "She further says "I hate myself, Shyam. I hate myself. And I hate my face and the stupid mirror that shows me this face.... Can I get my face altered?" (Bhagat, P-142,143).

Thus, women have to face many obstacles in modern contemporary society. They are asked

She is a modern girl in her outfits who does not like other's interference. She works in a call center in night shift, wears clothes which give modern look to her without caring other's comment. In starting she follows her mother's instructions but when grows young she starts to protest that her mother is trying to dominate her without any reason. Later on, we see she is disturbed about her future life if she marries with Shyam because he is not well settled. That is why Pryinka agrees to marry with NRI boy Ganesh who earns more. She does not want any one's interference in her marriage and wishes for a safe and comfortable life. She is a girl who needs time to understand her fiancé before getting married with him and protests his mother's hastiness for marriage.

All the characters of this novel are unhappy and unsatisfied with their life. Shyam is struggling hard to be well settled in life so that he may marry with Pryinka, because in modern age profession is given more importance than human being. When Vroom and Shyam meet Pryinka's cousin Anurag who is a doctor, he becomes less interested in talking after knowing their call center profession. Thus, we see modern youth are in

Through the character of Vroom author has presented the reality of call center job where agents have to face daily insult from customers. This is the reason behind India being so poor in spite of being more than seventy years of freedom. We are still not able to get good job and education in our country. All the characters hear the news of job cutting and get more disturbed about their future expenses. In 'Changing Construction Career', a study by Aileen Watson suggests, "that for the majority of call center agents, their occupation was not part of their career strategy" (Watson 158-160).

Shyam, wants to earn money to complete his B.Ed. Pryinka just does the job for time pass until she gets married with a well settled man, Esha earns money to be a model, Vroom opts because call center pays more than journalism, Thus, we see all work in call center only to meet their needs not for their passion. N. Velmani says, global capitalism in India can be achieved only by accepting privatization. To solve unemployment issue government should take initiative steps by constructing roads, power plants, airports, phone networks and metro trains in every city so that youth can find employment easily. All these characters take

He becomes agitated, inside feels jealous when he hears about her fiancé profession. In modern age people gives importance to income more than humanity.

Pryinka is not cheerful about her NRI fiancé but for her mother, she is extremely happy with Ganesh's profession. Shyam and Pryinka's break up takes place only due to her mother's great expectancy of getting her married with prosperous wealthy man. Her mother is very happy since she has been engaged with Ganesh. On the other hand, we see Military uncle is also ignored by his son and daughter in law for his irritable and

I don't want even your shadow on his life also. Please stay away and do not send him any more emails for literally or otherwise we don't want your attachments." (Bhagat, P-150).

Through the mail of Military uncle's son, clearly the attitude of our young generation is expressed. Children are becoming indifferent for their parent's struggle and hard work, what they faced in bringing up them. In old age parents are unable to carry on their own burden but children also hate their miserable conditions. This is the result of their western influence. Pryinka does call center job only to fulfill her high expectation which can be performed only by earning money, though she has limited resources. We see Esha does call center job to earn money to be a model, and Radhika to support her inlaws financially. Vroom has caliber to start his own company but he does not want to take the risk of losing call center job. Military uncle is here to meet his needs. Through the study of all character, we see all are disturb and without confidence. They lose their confidence considering themselves black sheep of the family because they don't learn properly. People don't give them respect and no one notices them. Financial problem is the main problem in the country like India, where many students have to opt job rather than going for further study or higher education, Vroom wanted to be a journalist but had to leave student life. On the other hand, Shyam wished to complete his B.Ed. but had to do job for gathering the money for doing B.Ed. In this second novel we see
